## School Uniform

The school uniform is:

- ☐ Navy blue sweatshirt or jumper - either with the school logo or plain.
- ☐ White or pale blue shirts, polo shirts, blouses or t shirts - either with the school logo or plain.
- ☐ Grey or navy blue skirts, trousers, shorts or pinafores.
- ☐ Sensible black shoes (not boots)
- ☐ In the summer the girls may wear blue and white check dresses.

For PE, children must change into navy blue or black shorts and a plain white t shirt or a leotard. Children are not allowed to do PE in their normal school clothes for hygiene reasons. For outdoor PE the children will require trainers. Children will work in bare feet or pumps for indoor PE.

**Please mark your child's name on all of their clothes and belongings.** This helps considerably if a child thinks they have lost any items of clothing.

We believe that wearing a school uniform promotes equality, a sense of belonging and a pride in who we are. It is, therefore, school policy to insist that children wear the uniform as described above.

There will be spot checks by me regularly through the term. However, I do appreciate there might be times when the uniform cannot be worn (torn, broken, lost etc). Please can you let your child's class teacher know when this is the case and replace the items as soon as you can. Thank you.
